

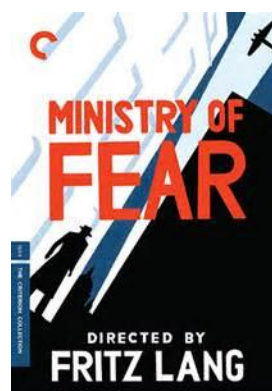
## Oradell Public Library Presents IFC Film Club

Oradell Public Library founded the film discussion group, IFC Film Club, in January 2014, modeled on our two successful book discussion groups, the Morning Book Club and the Evening Book Club. "IFC" stands for "Independent \* Foreign \* Classic". The film club meets on fourth Mondays of the month at 7 p. m.

Our first discussion was held on Monday, January 27, 2014 with *Chinatown* (1974), which celebrated its 40th anniversary in 2014.



Recent film discussions have been on:



### Upcoming in 2017 are:

Monday, July 24, 2017 – *Far From Heaven* (2002), an imitation of a Douglas Sirk-style melodrama set in mid-1950s Connecticut, directed by Todd Haynes and starring Julianne Moore and Dennis Quaid as a seemingly perfect married couple, who face a number of crises.

Monday, August 28, 2017 – *Do the Right Thing* (1989), Spike Lee's ever-relevant look at race relations set during the hottest day of the year in Bedford-Stuyvesant, Brooklyn.

Monday, September 25, 2017 – *The Lovers* (*Les amants*, 1958), Louis Malle's first dramatic film, which begins as a typical French social comedy and ends as a highly romantic excursion, literally and figuratively. The film is important in American legal history as it resulted in a court case that questioned the definition of obscenity.
