How to Get Tickets to see Hamilton – an American Musical

1. Ticket prices for the New York Broadway production are \$845 – Center Orchestra and \$179.99 and \$199.99. Generally, tickets are not available from the Box Office online. When a new block of seats is released the tickets are bought immediately by ticket brokers.
2. Tickets may be purchased through ticket brokers at a substantial mark-up any time.
3. Stand on line outside of the Richard Rodgers Theatre - 226 West 46th Street - 30 minutes before show time for cancellation tickets.
4. Enter Hamilton Official Ticket Lottery.

21 front row tickets will be sold to winners of the Official Broadway Digital Lottery for every performance. There are 8 performances a week and 168 tickets awarded weekly. After the lottery closes, you will be notified via email within minutes as to whether you won or not.

The lottery seats are front row of the theatre (not guaranteed but very likely) and are \$10 a ticket with a maximum of two tickets. If you are selected as a winner, you have 60 minutes to pay for your tickets. Chances of winning are: 900 to 1.
